

## The Great Falls Grange: 9818 Georgetown Pike (Rte. 193). This classic public assembly hall, a product of the Grange Movement, was completed in 1929. Directions: A. If coming from I-495 (Beltway), exit at Virginia Exit 44 onto Rte. 193, Georgetown Pike; proceed west toward Great Falls, VA. (If coming south on I-495 from MD, you must exit onto a right service lane just after crossing the Potomac River.) Travel west on Rte. 193 toward Great Falls for 6.2 miles to the red-brick Grange on the right, just prior to the Village shopping center. B: If approaching from the west on Rte. 7, turn eastward onto Rte. 193 at Dranesville and go 3.1 miles east to Great Falls Village and continue 0.2 mile to the Grange on the left.

Park in lots and spaces for the Grange only.
